From tens of thousands of huge, gnarled oaks in medieval times, we have fewer than 1000 surviving today. Those trees which do survive are often aged misshapen oak-men, formed by nature, people and extreme weather.

Ian Rotherham is an Emeritus Professor at the Advanced Wellbeing Research Centre, Sheffield Hallam University, a Fellow of the Royal Society of Biology, and a specialist in ecology, landscape history and regional tourism development. He had written extensively on the history and ecology of forests, ancient woods and ancient trees.
